Jesus' Ascension into Heaven – 9 May



May's Teatime Church service is taking place on **Sunday 12th May, 4pm – 5:15pm**. At this service, we will be thinking about Jesus' ascension into heaven, which is particularly remembered on Ascension Day (9th May). In the ascension story (Acts 1:4-11), the disciples watch as Jesus ascends up into heaven. He promises to send them a special Holy Spirit helper and lets them know that he will always be with them. At this service, there will be crafts all about 'things that go up', including making hot air balloon collages, decorating doves, creating a large-scale cloud and having plenty of fun with balloons and bubbles! We will also be thinking about 'the God who creates' as part of the Thy Kingdom Come Prayer Movement – please see below for more details.



Church Sunday Club

The Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus

Resurrection

After his death, Jesus' body was taken down from the cross and placed into a rock tomb with a heavy stone covering its entrance. When his female followers visited the tomb the Sunday after his crucifixion, they saw that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb. Inside, Jesus' body was missing.

In the garden surrounding the tomb, there appeared a man dressed in white. The women pleaded with him to return Jesus' body, but the man explained that he *was* Jesus. Mary Magdalene went to the disciples to tell them the good news that **Jesus had risen from the dead**. Christians call these events the resurrection of Jesus.

Jesus is mentioned in the gospels as appearing many times over the next 40 days. Jesus' resurrection shows people the power of God but also teaches them not to be afraid of dying. His sacrifice overcame sin and offers humans hope of eternal life.

Ascension



40 days after Easter, the Church celebrates Jesus' ascension into heaven. **Jesus appeared to his disciples after the resurrection and told them that he was going back – ascending – up to his father, God, in heaven**, just like a bubble floating up into the air.

After Jesus had said this and while they were watching, he (Jesus) was taken up into a cloud (Acts 1:9-10).

Jesus had been seen many times during the 40 days after Easter, preparing his disciples – those people specifically chosen by Jesus to spread the gospel after Jesus' death and resurrection – to continue his work after his ascension, which was all part of God's plan.

The disciples could not carry out their mission of spreading Jesus' message without help, however. Jesus tells his disciples to stay in Jerusalem until they receive power from God. This power is God's **Holy Spirit**, who Jesus promises will come after he goes away.

After Jesus ascends into heaven, the disciples wait for the promised Holy Spirit, a new, invisible form of God.

Jesus' ascension is important to Christians because it shows that Jesus really had overcome death – he wasn't just resurrected to die again, but to live forever. For many Christians, the fact that Jesus' followers witnessed him ascending into the clouds leaves no doubt that Jesus is alive and with God the Father in heaven, and is no longer limited to living on earth.

50 days (7 weeks) after Easter Sunday, **Pentecost** brings the Easter season to an end (19th May). Pentecost celebrates Jesus fulfilling his promise to send the Holy Spirit to guide and help his disciples. The Holy Spirit is the third part of the **Trinity** – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – which are the three different parts of God, as the image below shows. It is the means by which God is active and with us all on Earth.



What happened before and after Ascension Day?

On Good Friday, Jesus was crucified on a cross and then buried in a tomb.

He was resurrected on Easter Sunday.

For the forty days following this, he visited a selection of different people, including his disciples, before ascending to heaven.

Ten days after Ascension Day, the disciples were visited by the Holy Spirit, on a day which is now known as Pentecost.

The Holy Spirit is often symbolised as a dove.

The Bible (Acts 1) says that Jesus will return one day, in the same way as he left.


Café in the Church
