The angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people'. (Luke, 2:10-11).

Our next **Teatime Church Service** takes place at the church from 4pm - 5:15pm on Sunday 7^{th} December and it will be all about the JOY of Christmas. The great joy of Christmas, of course, is the good news of Jesus' birth as Emmanuel (God With Us).

The Christmas Story



The Christmas Story can be found in the Bible in the Gospels of Luke and Matthew: Luke 2:1-20, Matthew 2: 1-12

Christmas is a Christian holy day that marks the birth of Jesus, the Son of God. Advent is the period just before Christmas Day. It means 'coming' and is all about preparing for Christmas Day. Christmas Day takes place each year on 25th December.

Christmas Day celebrates when Jesus was born to a woman called Mary who was engaged to Joseph, a carpenter, in the town of Nazareth in Galilee. Mary was visited by an angel who told her that she would give birth to a baby called Jesus. Jesus was born in Bethlehem because Joseph and Mary had travelled there to take part in a census (where information about people is collected) which the Roman rulers had ordered.

When Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem, the local inn was full with people returning for the census. The innkeeper let them stay in his stable for animals. It was here that Mary gave birth to Jesus.



Jesus was visited by three Wise Men from the East who had followed a special star to Bethlehem (this is known as the Epiphany – when Jesus was 'revealed' to the world, which we will thinking about more at Teatime Church in January). The star they followed was no ordinary star, comet, planet or eclipse. The Wise Men were experts in astronomy and had often studied the night sky. This star was exceptional, and God had provided it. It behaved as no other star had and led the Wise Men to Jesus.

The Wise Men presented Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, which each represented something about Jesus. Gold was the symbol of royalty – a gift for a king, frankincense was the symbol of prayer – a gift for a priest, and myrrh was a burial ointment – a gift for one who would die.



An angel also guided some poor shepherds to Jesus. The fact that Jesus was visited by rich, wise men; poor, humble shepherds; and both Jews and non-Jews, shows that Jesus came for *all* people of *all* backgrounds.



Christians believe that God sent Jesus to live as a human being in order to save humanity from the consequences of its sins – the bad things that people had chosen to do which had separated them from God.

Christians also believe that through the death and later resurrection of Jesus on Easter Day, this broken relationship with God was restored.

Christmas Day celebrates the day this amazing baby, Jesus, was born – it's his birthday! Christians believe that God loves the whole world and gave Jesus as a gift to us all. He brought love, hope and joy to the world. Christians model themselves on the life and teachings of Jesus – Jesus taught people to love God and to love their neighbour.

So we have good reason to celebrate Christmas – Jesus was the greatest Christmas present of them all!


The Mix Christmas Event: A message from The Mix
